



2021 LAW Youth Summer Program (YSP) CANADIAN HISPANIC BAR ASSOCIATION (CHBA) SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

INSTRUCTIONS

Every summer, high school students are offered a unique law school experience by the University of Toronto's Faculty of Law. During the Law YSP, students currently enrolled in grades 10 through 12 can spend between one and five weeks at the Faculty of Law discussing advanced legal concepts, learning about the reality of the Canadian legal system, and applying their knowledge in a variety of stimulating environments. For the summer of 2021 activities will be delivered online synchronously, meaning that students will attend live lectures and perform virtual activities all at the same time with live support from teaching staff. Each module is designed to maximize interactions between students, professors, and instructors, in an engaging and friendly environment.

The Law YSP has partnered with the Canadian Hispanic Bar Association to support high school students with an interest in exploring the legal profession and the legal field in the areas of criminal law, law and politics, trial advocacy, corporate law and international law. Scholarships are offered on the merit of each student's application and their demonstrated financial need. All scholarships cover the full cost of the program for **one of the seven virtual modules**.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Open to full time high school students who identify as Hispanic or Latinx enrolled in a Canadian high school
- Eligible applicants must commit to participating in the YSP virtually for the entire week of the program
- Must currently be in grade 10, 11 or 12
- Demonstrated financial need
- Eligible applicants must have demonstrated academic excellence.

Disclaimer: If the scholarship applicant has already registered for a YSP module the applicant will no longer be eligible for the YSP scholarship.

Scholarship recipients will be contacted by as soon as the decision is made.
