All scholarships cover the full cost of the program for **one of the five virtual modules**.

- Why you should be considered for a scholarship

Eligibility Requirements:

- Open to full time high school students
- Must self-identify as Indigenous (First Nations, Metis or Inuit)
- Must commit to participating in the YSP virtually for the entire duration of the week
- Must currently be in grade 10, 11 or 12
- Demonstrated financial need
- Demonstrated academic excellence.

Disclaimer: If the scholarship applicant has already registered for a YSP module the applicant will no longer be eligible for the YSP scholarship.
